Mattie looked closely at him. He seemed awake—confused but alert. He seemed like Bell.

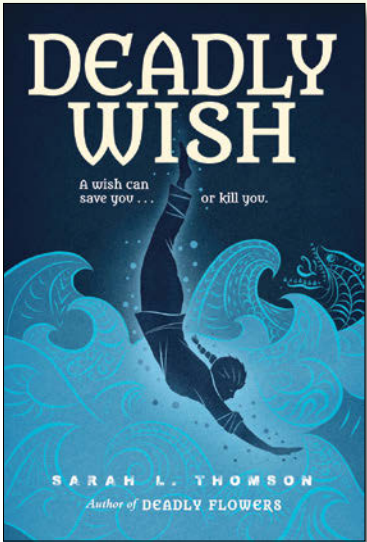

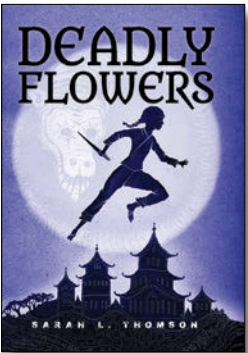

When Livvy’s mother abruptly moves the two of them across the country to San Francisco, sixteen-year-old Livvy is shocked to find her mother has lied to her. Instead of working for a bakery, Livvy’s mom is actually taking care of Livvy’s grandmother who she thought was long dead. Suffering from Alzheimer’s, Livvy’s grandmother begins to shout strange things, mistake her own name, and relive moments that may have taken place in a concentration camp. When Livvy and her new friend and potential boyfriend Franklin D. find journal entries from the Holocaust in Livvy’s grandmother’s home, Livvy begins to suspect that her grandmother may have a shocking link to a notable figure—Anne Frank.

This intriguing book has gut-wrenching plot twists and a strong heroine, making this a compulsively readable mystery.

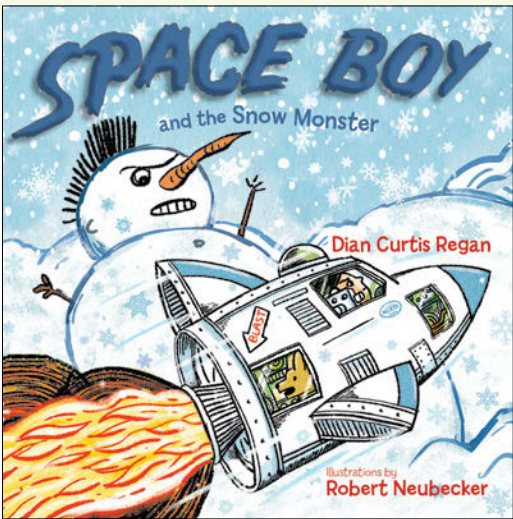

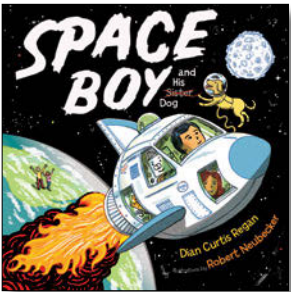

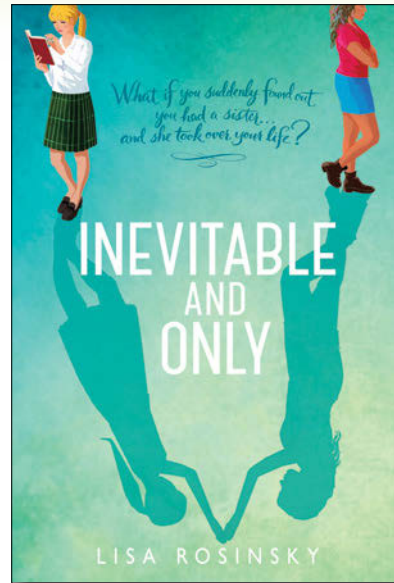

I rolled my eyes. “You bike to work and Mom drives, like, less than ten miles a day.”

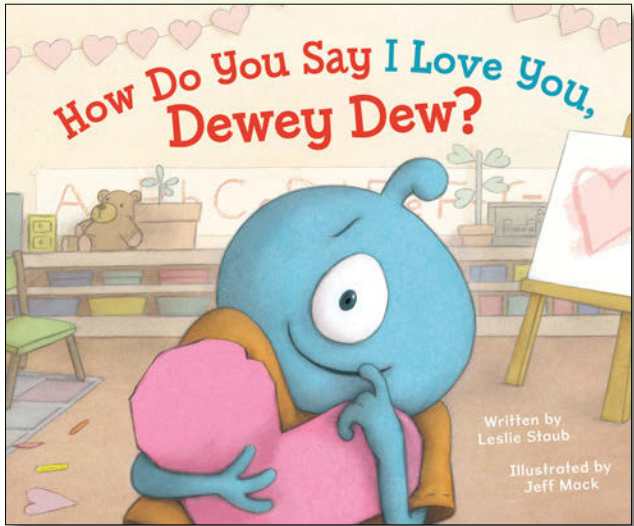

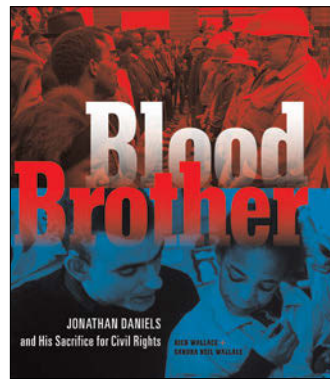
In the years following the Civil War, “Arctic fever” gripped America, fueled by myths of a fertile, tropical sea at the top of the world. In 1879, George Washington De Long and the USS *Jeannette* departed San Francisco, hoping to find a route to the North Pole. By mid-September the ship became locked in ice north of Siberia and drifted for nearly two years before it sank. De Long and his crew escaped the ship and began a treacherous journey in polar conditions to save themselves. The heroic expedition ultimately proved tragic when many, De Long included, did not survive.

To tell this riveting true-life adventure, noted nonfiction authors Sandra Neil Wallace and Rich Wallace relied on excerpts from De Long’s journals, newspaper accounts, and sketches from crew members to capture the courage and endurance of the men on this doomed journey.

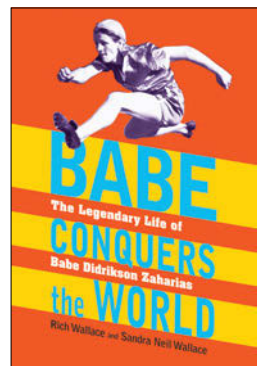

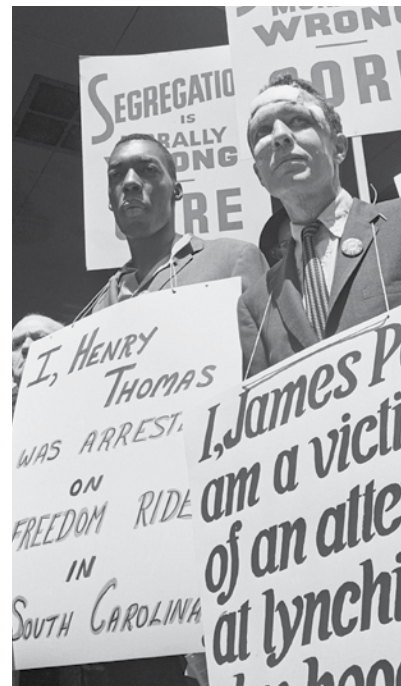
TWELVE DAYS IN MAY *Freedom Ride 1961*
