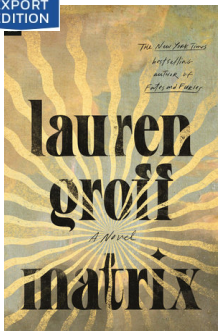

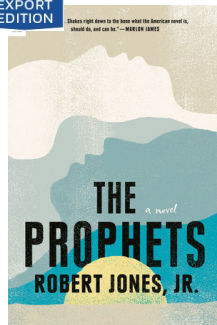

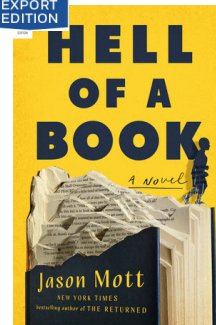
The Prophets

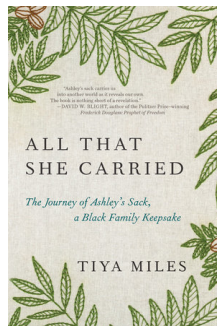

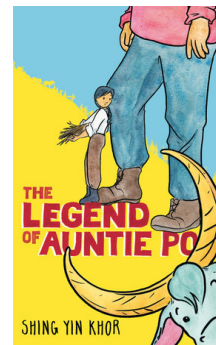

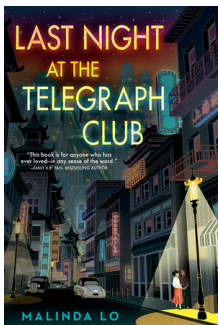
