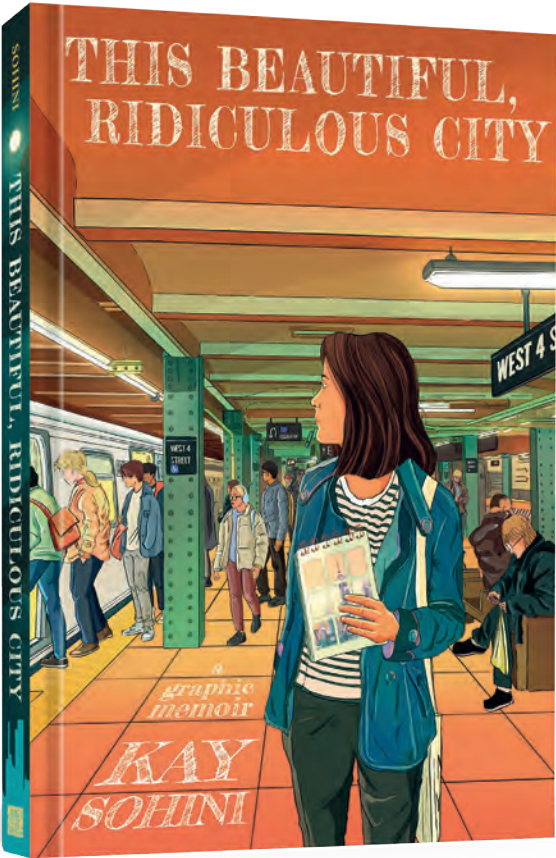

A vibrant graphic memoir of a woman—an immigrant, a survivor, a writer, a foodie, and, ultimately, an optimist—who rebuilds her life in New York City while recovering from the trauma of an abusive relationship.

On her first night in New York City, Kay Sohini sits on the tarmac of JFK Airport making an inventory of everything she’s left behind in India: her family, friends, home, and gaslighting ex-boyfriend. In the wake of that untethering, she realizes two things: She’s finally made it to the city of her literary heroes—Kerouac, Plath, Bechdel—and the trauma she’s endured has created gaping holes in her memory.

As Kay begins the work of piecing herself back together, she discovers a deep sense of belonging that can be discovered only on the streets of New York City. In the process she falls beautifully, ridiculously in love with the bustling landscape, and she realizes that the places we love do not always love us back but can still somehow save us in weird, unexpected ways.

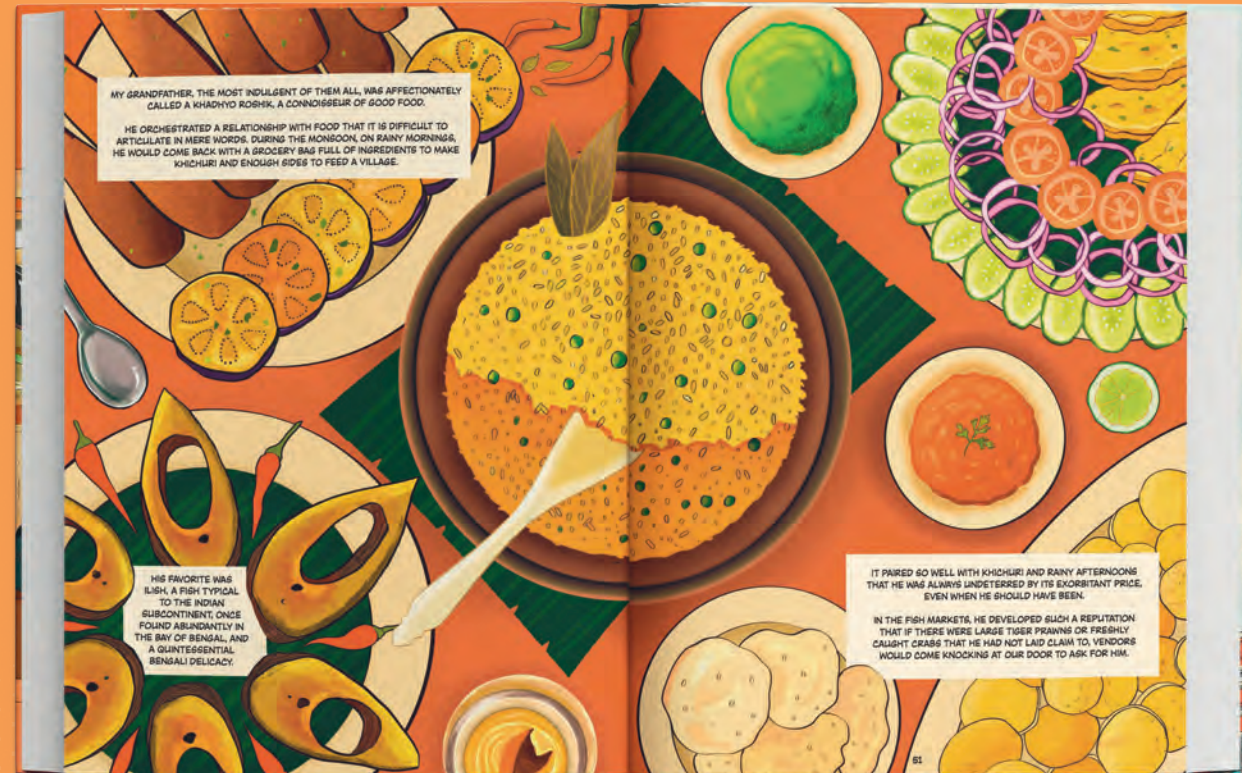

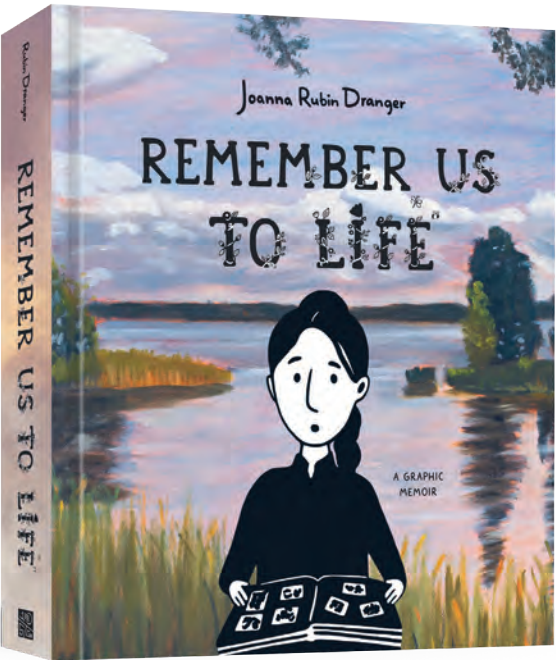

REMEMBER US TO LIFE

A Graphic Memoir

by Joanna Rubin Dranger

WINNER OF THE NORDIC COUNCIL LITERATURE PRIZE • Available for the first time in English: a moving and masterful graphic memoir exploring one woman’s search for identity as she slowly uncovers the truth of how her Jewish relatives “disappeared” during World War II.

Told through a genre-defying blend of illustrations, photography, and found objects, *Remember Us to Life* chronicles Joanna Rubin Dranger’s investigation into her Jewish family’s history, spanning time, space, and three continents in search of her lost relatives. As discolored photos are retrieved from half-forgotten moth-eaten boxes, Joanna discovers the startling modernity and vibrancy of the lives her family never spoke about—and the devastating violence that led to their senseless murders.

Carefully researched and expertly told, *Remember Us to Life* recounts Joanna’s family’s immigration from Poland and Russia to Sweden and Israel, where her relatives found work, marriage, and community, blissfully unaware of the horrors to come. Interweaving these anecdotes and stories are historical accounts of the persecution of Jewish people in Germany, Poland, Lithuania, and Russia prior to and during World War II, as well as the antisemitic policies and actions of the supposedly neutral government of Sweden, Joanna’s home country. Joanna’s unflinchingly brave and intimate portrayal of one of history’s greatest tragedies will capture and break readers’ hearts.

Following in the tradition of classics such as Art Spiegelman’s *Maus* and Marjane Satrapi’s *Persepolis*, *Remember Us to Life* is a thought-provoking exploration of grief, alienation, and reclamation of one’s history.



Joanna Rubin Dranger is an award-winning Swedish graphic novelist, illustrator, and writer. Her accolades include the Stora Svenska Illustrators Prize, the Swedish Series Academy’s Adamson statuette, the International Film Critics Award (the FIPRESCI Prize), and the Nordic Council Literature Prize. She was the first female professor of illustration at Konstfack University of Arts, Crafts, and Design and lives in Stockholm with her husband and their three children.



In 1929, the same year that women voted in Germany for the first time, the Academy of Arts in Berlin opened its doors to female artists. Lette applied and was admitted. She painted *Self-Portrait with Cat* the year after her graduation.



Lette was invited to participate in exhibitions and contests; she was praised and celebrated, and in 1931 she had her first solo show in Berlin.



But from 1935 onward, she was no longer permitted to exhibit. Two of Lette's paintings were shown in connection with the World Exposition in Paris in 1937, but her works were banned from the German Pavilion.

The offer of an exhibition at Galerie Moderne in Stockholm in December 1937 made it possible for Lette to leave Hitler's Germany.



The picture of Susanne, who looks like me as an adult, lovingly embracing me as a child, actually exists as a photo, but it is also a symbolic image.



The empathy that Susanne showed for me when I was a child sometimes helps me to feel sympathy for myself now.



It was with Susanne that I had long, intimate conversations about the emotional and ethical questions that I wrestled with in my teens.



When I was a young adult, Susanne's strong sense of justice, empathy, and humanitarianism was my ideal. She worked to strengthen the rights of women and girls in Vietnam and India, evaluating projects for the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency and Save the Children.



And it was Susanne who gave me the groundbreaking graphic novel *Plaus*, which is about the Holocaust, when it was published in Sweden, long before I knew that I would make graphic novels myself.

The children work in the store and place orders for new goods. Once, Eva's order goes wrong instead of one or two small-sized ladies' coats, there are forty-six! Eva is upset and worried, but Aren says:



—It's not dangerous, Eva! There are always small women! They won't run out this year, and they won't run out next year! Not dangerous!



—If I have overcoats, I have overcoats. If I have money, it's just one coin!



In 1932, Dora and David get married. Rebecca and Aren love David like a son and are so happy that they cry at the wedding. Dora and David have two children just a year apart, Naomi and Allan. But Hitler's rise to power in Germany casts a shadow over the family's happiness.

In 1936, a year after the Nuremberg Laws were established, the Olympics are to be held in Berlin. Jewish, Catholic, and African American organizations in the USA protest, as do the trade unions. Demonstrations are organized in several countries, and in Sweden, member of Parliament Georg Branting and newspaper editor Torngy Segerstedt argue for a boycott. But only Spain boycotts the games, and the Berlin Olympics become precisely the successful propaganda Hitler hopes for.

It is the first time—and, as it will turn out, the last time—that Perla meets her grandchildren before the "disappears."

That David's mother, Perla, visited Hiddin in Sweden in 1937 is something I discover when my cousin finds an old photo album in a box in her attic.



Five years after Perla's visit to Hiddin, David's entire family in Grodno has "disappeared."

—These photos of men, women, and children murdered in June in Białystok were published in the Russian paper *Nova* on June 24, 1906.



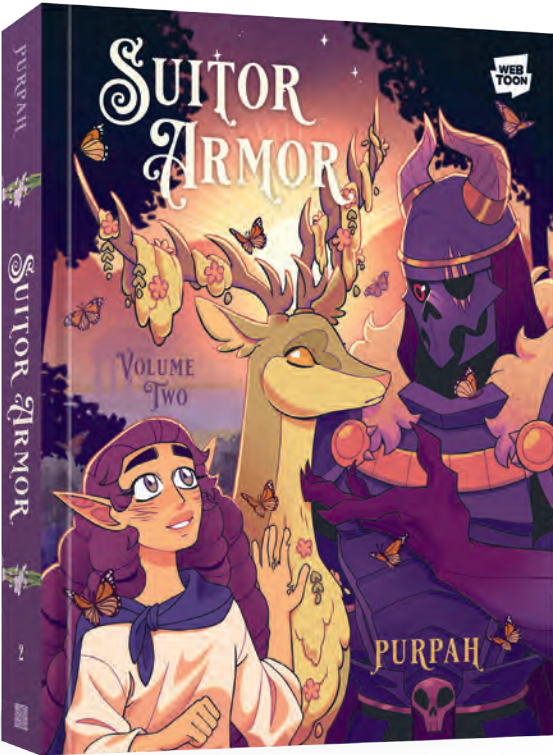
Rebecca and Aren, with little Elias, decide to leave for Sweden, where Aren had worked just a few years earlier.

There’s no better writer to tell the colorful history of cocktails than David Wondrich, widely considered to be one of the world’s foremost authorities on cocktails and a driving force behind the early-twenty-first-century revival in the classic American art of mixing drinks.
